MILLIONS WASTED!

- Tens of millions of dollars in legal fees and lawsuit payouts have been spent defending the mayor against sexual harassment claims, misconduct, and breach of contract. \$15 million alone was paid to an LAPD officer who was paralyzed when the mayor ran a red light while driving a city vehicle and struck him.

NEPOTISM!

- Both of Butts' daughters, his goddaughter, and family friends work at city hall earning salaries that vastly exceed the average household income in Inglewood. One daughter who was previously convicted of felony assault is reportedly working as a high level decision-maker under the alias, Asha Yvette Ealy.

FRAUD!

- The top recipients of "Destination Market Street" grants (\$250K each) all happen to use a Butts appointed Planning Commissioner, David Rice, as their contractor. Dozens of other small businesses were denied funding and have since closed their doors. Most grant winners are part of the mayor and the Planning Commissioner's inner circle.

CORRUPT CONTRACT AWARDS!

- Lisa Trifiletti, the disgraced former LAWA deputy who left for the private sector after a DUI in a county vehicle, was awarded a \$20 million Inglewood Transit Connector contract by Mayor Butts. The project was rejected by residents and surrounding mayors. The ITC project has already displaced dozens of local businesses through eminent domain and dozens more are set to be displaced.

Glossy press releases and ribbon-cuttings hide the real story. While City Hall celebrates a stadium-fueled "building blitz," longtime Inglewood residents and small businesses are being pushed out, family members of the administration draw six-figure city paychecks, and millions in public dollars flow to a tight inner circle of insiders, former staff, and politically connected consultants.

The receipts are in the public records, if you know where to look.

INGLEWOOD RESIDENTS & BUSINESSES ARE CAUGHT IN THE MIDDLE AND ON THE HOOK FOR MILLIONS

The stadiums get the highlight reel. The neighborhood gets the bill.

● EXCESSIVE SIGNAGE

A 40-year billboard monopoly through 2065 with the city's profits drastically reducing over time. Commercial kiosks labeled "emergency services" to dodge zoning limits.

● POLLUTION & HEALTH

Idling traffic, light pollution from billboards, and construction dust all borne by residents, not the league.

● TRAFFIC & GRIDLOCK

Game days and concerts choke our streets. Eminent domain seizures for "mobility hubs" displace businesses, not stadiums.

● NO COMMUNITY BENEFIT

Billions in stadium revenue. Billboard money pouring in. No real community benefits agreement for residents.

WHO MADE IT POSSIBLE?

A mayor who personally negotiated the deals. A city council that rubber-stamps the mayor's decisions. Consultants and staff paid excessively to defend the agenda in public meetings, on blogs, and in the press.

Meanwhile we get the noise, dust, displacement and the legal bills from the mayor's lawsuits and bad business deals paid out of OUR taxes.
